

Buyer Dossier: MISSION SUPPORT WASHINGTON

How this office buys. MISSION SUPPORT WASHINGTON, the acquisition office for Immigration and Customs Enforcement, is the most winnable target in this entire engagement, and the three numbers under Competition behavior are the reason: **a median of 1 offer received, 100% of awards set aside for small business, and 100% going to firms determined small.** A median of one offer means the winning bidder was, in a typical award here, the only bidder. This is not a crowded procurement being fought over; it is a requirement being filled by whoever is registered, eligible, and known to the contracting officer.

The buying pattern is a small number of substantial awards rather than a stream of small ones: \$1,131,061 on a single transaction in FY2024, \$842,195 across three in FY2025, and \$223,677 on one so far in FY2026. Scope combines electronic security and physical perimeter work at ICE facilities, which is why the incumbent is a communications integrator rather than a fencing contractor.

How to approach it. Introduce the firm as the physical-barrier specialist this office currently has to buy through an integrator, and do it before the September expiry rather than after.

The entry angle. There is exactly one incumbent worth naming: Access Communications Group, with \$2,198,709 across 2 awards, and their \$1,030,750 contract (award 70CMSW25C00000018) **ends 2026-09-11**, roughly seven weeks out. The other two vendors on this page are not competitors in any meaningful sense (Axis Global Enterprises at \$0 obligated, Prime Masonry at a negative \$1,776 de-obligation). In a 100% small-business-set-aside office with a median of one offer, a single credible additional bidder changes the outcome, and right now there is no other bidder.

Access Communications is also on the teaming shortlist, and that is not a contradiction. They are an El Paso communications integrator who subcontracts physical fencing. The realistic first move here is to be their named subcontractor on the follow-on, and the second is to compete directly once past performance at this office exists.

Next three actions.

1. **Contact the contracting officer this week.** Daniel Correia, iceoacmissionsupport@ice.dhs.gov, sourced from public SAM.gov notices. With the incumbent contract ending 2026-09-11, market research for the follow-on is either underway or about to be, and FAR Part 10 makes an unsolicited capability statement a normal input to it.
2. **Call Access Communications Group in parallel** (915-845-0007, SAM active through 2027-06-25) and offer to be the named fencing subcontractor on their recompetes proposal. This costs them nothing and strengthens their bid.
3. **Confirm small business size status under 238990 before either conversation.** Every award at this office is set aside, so the representation in SAM is the qualifying credential. If it is wrong or stale, nothing else on this page is reachable.

Figures cover Saguaro Fence & Perimeter LLC's codes only, not this office's entire budget. Value figures are current total award value including multi-year IDIQ/BPA ceilings. Obligated figures are dollars actually obligated in the covered fiscal years. The two are different scopes and are never directly comparable.
